ITEM NO. 5: ACI multistate grant update.

Presented by Jenifer Wisniewski, Immediate Past President

- Excited to announce we have two more grants for 2022.
- Grant One: Social Listening- DJ Case and Associates will provide a report every two weeks to each ACI
 member agency/organization. If we want to include additional 'hashtags', we can give DJ Case that
 information to receive specific information on the reports.
- Grant Two: Round three of the \$50,000 state grant for R3 marketing- In 2021, Jenifer Wisniewski stated the grants committee reviewed 22 of "the best grant applications I have ever read". Five states were selected from those applications for the second round. For round three, the next five "best" grant applications from those 22 were selected: Kansas, Florida, Alabama, Michigan and Kentucky.



ITEM NO. 5: ACI multistate grant update continued.

- Lance Cherry emphasized as communicators, it's important to understand what we are facing (i.e., antihunting groups), expressing excitement about the social listening grant. He stated Jenifer Wisniewski created a legacy for ACI and hopes we continue the grants program for years to come.
- Craig Sanchez added Jenifer's work has propelled ACI into a new realm.
- Jenifer Wisniewski reiterated that in three years, we have facilitated \$2 million in grants.

ITEM NO. 8: 2021 ACI Conference Update.

- It was recommended by several board members we consider a hybrid conference using Whova or similar platform. Regarding the pandemic, the future is unknown so it would be wise to consider this option.

- Awards are in the process of being shipped out. Still working with K2 awards and getting invoicing squared away.
- Expressed concern about simultaneously managing the awards program and organizing/hosting the 2023 conference. May consider recruiting a new awards chair for 2023.

- ACI did not provide scholarships this past year because the conference was virtual and free.
- Scholarship recipients are required to provide content for the Balance Wheel, so we are seeking content for the newsletter.

- Joanne M. volunteered to help assist Jenifer with this committee moving forward.

ITEM Two:

- Judy Stokes Weber reminded the board we used to have four regional liaison positions in ACI. These
 positions were created to help keep an eye on what is happening in each Association of Fish and Wildlife
 Agencies (AFWA) region and/or other organizations. Liaison would then report back to the board
 periodically.
- Providing ACI members an opportunity to serve in this capacity would help them serve the organization and help work their way into board and officer positions in the future if desired.
- Recommended we start thinking of people who would be candidates for these positions.
