- Judy Stokes Weber said ACI is in a good financial position due the result of hard work from officers and board members. Blake Podhajsky worked to bring several new members on board.
- She collects the funds for membership and award entries and will be following up with those still due.

ITEM NO. 11: ACI Multi-State Grants Committee Update. Presented by Jenifer Wisniewski, Grants Committee Chair

- Jenifer Wisniewski works for the National Deer Association and has been the grants chair since 2019 which have secured over \$500,000 in program funding
- Grants underway include:
 - 5 states doing R3 marketing campaigns
 - 4 states testing YouTube ads
 - Social listening- DJ Case scans social media platforms to see when your state agency or info about your agency is mentioned online and will send a report on it
 - Collecting imagery to add to the R3 Clearinghouse
- Proposals have been submitted for 5 grants for 2025
- Contact Jenifer Wisniewski if interested in helping or have grant ideas

ITEM NO. 12: Ways and Means Report. Presented by Blake Podhajsky, President, on behalf of Micah Holmes

- Blake Podhajsky said the committee is based around policies and procedures, by-laws, etc.

MEMBERSHIP

As of 06/30/24, ACI has its highest number of members in recent history.
